All: Dearest Jesus, you are the truth—the embodiment of reality, the incarnation of certainty, the one who "is the same yesterday, today, and forever." And so there are no new truths, only truths new to me. Therefore, let me be content to learn the eternal realities I do not know, but keep me from pursuing spiritual things never known by anyone. Give me the humility to accept that on my own I may not know the difference and the grace to subject every belief I hold to the microscope of your word as interpreted and applied by the elders You ordain, the undershepherds You appointed for my spiritual well-being. Lord Jesus, my pride struggles with this because I may have to—will have to—admit being wrong. Help me accept this. Remind me that I am merely human and not God. Jesus, You alone are both. So I ask for Your help. You understand my human weakness. And You have the divine power I need. Keep me from being "led away by diverse and strange teaching," for the sake of Your glory. Amen.

RESPONDING TO GOD

The Gospel As Found in John 3:16 **"For God so loved the world..."** God's love is so remarkable because He loves us not for who we are, but in spite of who we are. Difficult words --- lies, selfishness, and more; we are guilty of all of these and so much more. No matter what we've done, God still loves us.

As sinners who have broken God's commandments, we deserve His anger rather than his love. But God loves us so much that instead of turning His back on us, He turns His face toward us, by seeing us, His children, through His Son; whom He sent as our Saviour over two thousand years ago. His love provided this gift that only He could give.

"...that He gave his only Son..." The gift given, is God's Son—Jesus Christ. Because we have sinned, we deserve to die and be separated from God forever. But God gave His Son to take our punishment, to serve our deserved penalty. Jesus Christ is God's own son. He is perfect. Christ is our substitute. On a cross two thousand years ago, He died for our sins. As God, Jesus came back to life, proving He had conquered sin and death once and for all.

"...that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life." Jesus did not mean "whoever goes to church, is baptized, helps the poor, or tries to live a good life." Whoever is not the wealthy, the good neighbor, the downtrodden, the officer at church, the volunteer at the Food Pantry, or the struggling single parent—"Whoever" is every single person who believes in faith that Jesus is the Son of God and puts their trust in Him. Amazingly, that faith to believe comes also as a gift, by God's grace. (Eph 2:8-10). Given to, not earned by, the recipients of that Grace.


